### Message from the Principal



Dear Parents and Guardians,

As we approach the end of week three in the first half term, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on what has been a tremendously positive start to the academic year. I've been truly impressed by the students' attitudes and their efforts in lessons. ### Imperial College London - Year 12 Chemistry Taster Day

On Tuesday, 10th September, 27 of our year 12 students had the exciting opportunity to attend a Chemistry Taster Day at Imperial College London. After lunch, students took part in an interactive practical session in the Briscoe Laboratory, guided by the university's technical team and student mentors. This allowed them to experience firsthand what it's like to work in a university laboratory setting.
