We're thrilled to share some fantastic news with you this week! We've just received our final validated Progress 8 score from the Department for Education, and the results are phenomenal. For those unfamiliar with Progress 8, it's a key performance measure that judges how well schools are helping students progress from the end of primary school through their secondary education. The national average for Progress 8 is zero, so any score above that shows that students are making better-than-expected progress.

We're incredibly proud to announce that our Progress 8 score has risen to an impressive +0.91! This is a huge achievement, and we want to give full credit to our incredible teachers and the hardworking students of last year. We are now eagerly awaiting to see where this score places us nationally, but we're confident that we'll

rank among the top-performing schools in the country. This sets the tone for the high-performance school we are striving to be, and we are committed to sustaining this level of success for all our current students.

In addition to our academic achievements, we've had a busy and exciting week celebrating Black History Month. This celebration will continue into next week, and we're particularly looking forward to our *International Evening* on the 23rd. We warmly invite all families to join us for an evening of socialising, with delicious food and live performances. Please bring a dish to share, and join us from 4:30 pm, with the event officially starting at 5:00 pm. It promises to be a wonderful evening of community and culture.
